	An email from Councillor Ellis was received and the following corrections were PROPOSED by Councillor			
	Johnston-Banks: 'The foul and surface water drainage does NOT run down Long St, and turn sharp 90° into York Rd!			
	It powers on as it is under a head that goes back to church hill, and carries on to the Stillington Rd and then goes through to the end of Broadlea along Ingleton Drive (as does all the sewage from			
	Leasemires etc). Once these two have joined at the bottom of Ingleton Drive - in the back garden of #1			
	Thornton Close, the pipe then goes west to the York Rd pumping station.			
	Thornton crose, the pipe their goes west to the Tork Rd pumping station.			
	The "by pass" pipe in question along York Rd., is a 525mm (?) pipe over most of its length - but for			
	about 10 feet or so, restricts to 300mm and then joins the main Long St / Stillington Rd pipe at right			
	angles.			
	There is no chance that the fast flowing water through the Long St / Stillington Rd pipes will turn			
	sharply into the smaller 12" pipe (OK, 300mm) and go down York Rd!
